## Financial Summary

The net asset value (NAV) per share at 31 May 2022 was 2,619 pence. The year to date NAV total return was $-5.6 \%$ and the share price total return was $-10.8 \%$. Over the same period, the Company's two indices, CPI plus $3 \%$ and MSCI All Country World Index ( $50 \%$ Sterling), were up $5.0 \%$ and down $-9.0 \%$ respectively. The average net quoted equity exposure for the year to date was $37 \%$. The share price closed at 2,435 pence per share.
