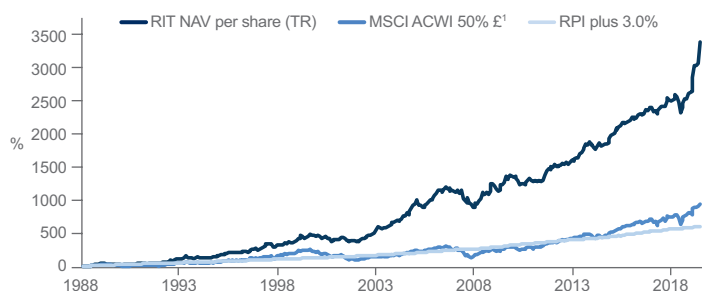

Financial Summary

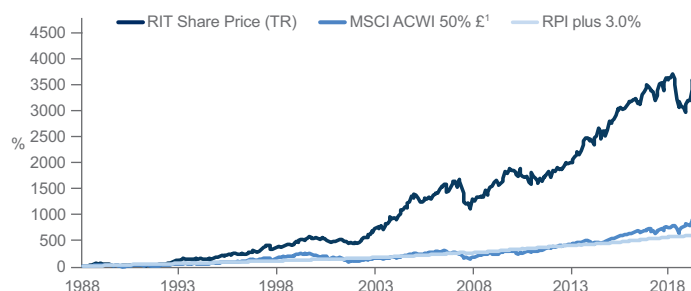
The net asset value (NAV) per share at 31 March was 2,561 pence. The year to date NAV total return was 11.8% and the share price total return was 16.2%. Over the same period, the Company's two indices; RPI plus 3% and MSCI All Country World Index (50% Sterling) were up 1.1% and 4.6% respectively. The average net quoted equity exposure for the year to date was 45%. The share price closed at 2,400 pence per share.

¹ The ACWI refers to the MSCI All Country World Index and is calculated using 50% of the index measured in Sterling and 50% measured in a Sterling hedged ACWI. The Sterling hedged ACWI is used as it incorporates hedging costs, which the portfolio also incurs, to protect against currency risk. It is applied from 1 January 2015 (from when it is readily available), and prior to this date it uses the index measured in local currencies. Before December 1998, when total return indices were introduced, the index is measured using a capital-only version.

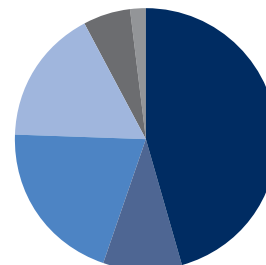

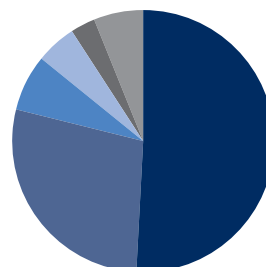

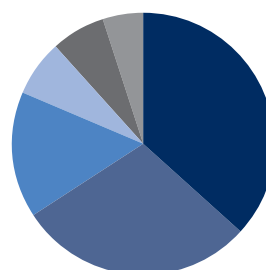

RIT Capital Partners plc (RIT) is an investment trust which aims to protect and enhance shareholders' wealth over the long term. J. Rothschild Capital Management Limited (JRMC) is a wholly-owned subsidiary of RIT and acts as RIT's Manager. Since listing on the London Stock Exchange in 1988, RIT has generated a share price total return of 11.7% per annum for its shareholders⁵. £10,000 invested in RIT at inception in 1988 would be worth ~£366,000 today⁵ (with dividends reinvested) compared to the same amount invested in the MSCI ACWI¹ which would be worth ~£99,000⁵.
